



I am the Son of God

Have you ever wondered who Jesus Christ is? What better place to go than the Word of God, for the Bible defines all of its characters, one of the greatest being God's son.

(John 10:31-40 KJV)
Then the Jews took up stones again to stone him.

The situation was dire, at least for the Pharisees. They were murderers and, like wild dogs, had tasted blood. Only the hand of God could intervene to save the son of God, Jesus Christ. These hateful beings stooped to the dirt to fuel their dirty work; they picked up stones and intended to stone Jesus.

{32} Jesus answered them, Many good works have I showed you from my Father; for which of those works do ye stone me?

Jesus watched them stoop; the wind rose and gusted,



sending their phylacteries flying into their faces. They had to shuffle around in the flying dust and straighten their garments so that they wouldn't look foolish. Maybe by how low a person stoops is how you know if someone is doing the devil's work? After all, they were leaders of the Jews and highly respected men. The murder spirits driving their shoulders down toward the ground didn't care about how they looked; they wanted Jesus dead; those grimy fingers were the extensions of volumes of fiery hate.

{33} The Jews answered him, saying, For a good work we stone

thee not; but for blasphemy; and because that thou, being a man, makest thyself God.

In their rage and complete absence of agape, they spoke. Never be deceived by another's ability to articulate. These empty vessels were so smart; they rejected Jesus' question and accused him of their very own faults. They were blasphemous and they had made themselves gods.

{34} Jesus answered them, Is it not written in your law, I said, Ye are gods? {35} If he called them gods, unto whom the word of God came, and the scripture cannot be broken; {36} Say ye of him, whom the Father hath sanctified, and sent into the world, Thou blasphemest; because I said, I am the Son of God?

You have to love that Jesus tapped into God's Word for his response. That's a great

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'hack' in today's anti-God/anti-Christ world.

Jesus was sanctified by the Father. That means that God had made Jesus holy.

Jesus was sent into the world; the Father had sent him. I'd say the credentials of Jesus were above reproach. The holy man, Jesus, had told the world, into which he was sent by the Father, that he was the son of God. He never told the world that he was God. Looks like these religious folks had dirt in their eyes—that's what stooping so low will get you. Verse 36 leaves no question; Jesus was and is the son of God.

{37} If I do not the works of my Father, believe me not.

Jesus told them as they were rubbing their stinging eyes to pay attention to what he was doing. Obviously, they were not paying attention. They probably couldn't see a thing. What Jesus told them still applies to us today. You can know a man by his works. If his works are false, or non-existent, leave him.

{38} But if I do, though ye believe not me, be-

lieve the works: that ye may know, and believe, that the Father is in me, and I in him.

Jesus made a big deal about works; he took the focus off the person doing the works. Humm, sounds godly, doesn't it? Of course it does. God is no respecter of persons, but clearly he respects the works a person is or should be doing. Jesus taught us in verse 38 that a person could know and believe because of seeing his works. Further, the new believer would know that the Father is in Jesus and that Jesus is in the Father. That's as close as Jesus came to saying that he was God.

{39} Therefore they sought again to take him: but he escaped out of their hand,

These supposed godly men were enraged and intent on murder, murdering the son of God. They were still picking at the dirt across their shoulders, and wiping their eyes, and spitting the gravel from between their teeth. They were right in front of him, but they had to reorganize enough to be able to see him. Isn't that something? Even so, Jesus escaped out of their

hand(s). That means that they actually nearly had him. Their hands had gotten a little too close, but God delivered him by his mighty angles. Don't think that he won't deliver you too. In the age in which we live, where the New Age Religion is flourishing, you need God's protection. This is the age where Jesus warned us of a resurgence of Nephilim giants, beasts, horrific creatures designed to destroy the image of God. Think of Noah, the preacher of righteousness, building the ark for nearly 100 years. He had to face those mutated humans, supernatural creatures, mutated insects, birds, fish, animals, and a host of other mutations day in and day out. Yet, he preached righteousness. I can't say what you might have to face, but I can say that Noah did just fine. What about Joshua and Caleb in the promised land. These men were protected by God; they had no fear of the mutant beasts roaming believer-land. You should have no fear as well.

{40} And went away again beyond Jordan into the place where John at first baptized; and there he abode.

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Feel free to go your way and there abide. You are a game changer. God has no hands but yours. We Christians are the only thing between complete annihilation of humanity and the return of Jesus Christ. Feel free to consider yourselves important, powerful, able to defy satan's giant mutations no matter what form they take. You are God's temple; you are God's abode. You have the son of God abiding in you right here, right now.
